At the bank our client card enables us to access our accounts. While in our car our driver's licence indicates to a police officer we have a right to be behind the wheel. Anyone who has ever lost one of these documents knows the problems which arise when we cannot prove our identity.

Baptism establishes our identity as Catholics. By washing away Original Sin, it indicates we are freed from the bondage of evil. Through making us part of the body of Christ, it identifies us as having a relationship with Jesus and the Church. In causing the gifts of the Holy Spirit to enter us, it provides us with the tools needed to build a Christian life.

Yet, do we protect this sign of our identity as well as we guard our passport or driver's licence? How easily do we give up our freedom from evil to pursue a higher standard of living? How quickly do we distance ourselves from Church teachings when it might cause social embarrassment? How often do we allow our gifts of the Holy Spirit to be dulled by a lack of use? Baptism is not an event which happened years ago but an identity we must maintain daily.

Can we really afford to lose it by neglect?

Breakfasts, Euchre and Bingo


I would like to thank everyone who has assisted and participated in the breakfasts, Bingo and Euchre Nights throughout the year.




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Rose for Life Campaign

By attending this concert, many people from outside the Niagara Region have been made aware of the wonderful things that God is doing through the Wells of Hope. Our sincere prayer is that numerous hearts have been touched as a result of the concert and in turn, those capable, will provide the much needed funds in order for the Wells of Hope to continue serving our less fortunate sisters and brothers.



On November 19th, numerous people gathered around a new home in the final stages of being built in Pelham. This new house has been erected through the generous contributions of the contractors and suppliers of the Niagara building

community, at little to no cost to the Wells of Hope. This house is now for sale on the open market and all the proceeds realized with the purchase of this home will almost totally clear the principle owing on the drilling equipment.

Ben Obdeyn of St. Ann's parish in Fenwick (also a founding member of the Board of Directors of

Wells of Hope), together with Ron Hendriks of St. Hellen's parish in Beamsville, and Frank Memme of Mountainview Homes, have been the front runners of organizing and realizing this tremendous "Build for Hope" fundraising initiative! INGREDIENTS:

10	Oz.	Dark Chocolate, Semi Sweet
18	Oz.	Butter, Unsalted
2 1/2	Oz.	Cocoa Powder
10	Oz.	Liquor Ribbons, Unsweetened
1	Pound	Sugar

PREPARATION:

Melt together first five ingredients in double boiler over medium heat. Add the eggs and yolks and mix until smooth and silky, being careful not to cook eggs. Sift the bread and cake flour together with the baking powder. Next add the chocolate/egg mixture, being very careful not to over mix.

Bake at 350°F for 8 to 10 minutes.

The cakes can be served in the ramekin or unmolded while still warm.

Serving with fresh whipped cream, a scoop of ice cream or a berry or vanilla sauce adds just the right finishing touch.
